A SECOND SURPLUS INVENTORY SALE SLATED FOR MAY 19

On Saturday, May 19, the Great Falls Model Railroad Club will hold a Surplus Inventory Sale at the club house at 144 Mill Street in Auburn from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. Sales items will include locomotives, rolling stock, railroad memorabilia, books, DVD's and videotapes. Many of these items have never been displayed at railroad shows.

On the same day and at the same times, on the lower level of the club building, members of the HO crew will hold a continuous series of clinics on the installation and use of DCC, the control system used on our HO layout. Model railroad fans are invited to see the HO layout in operation and to attend as many clinic sessions as you would like.

Both the Surplus Inventory Sale and the DCC clinics are open to the public, and there is no charge for admission.

4000 EGGS FOR WW&F

MEETING MINUTES OF FEBRUARY 15, 2018

A new format has been tried at the last two monthly meetings. A thirty-minute video is shown from 6:30 to 7:00 p.m. At 7:00 p.m., the meeting starts with a Power Point presentation of activities in which the club has been involved since the last meeting. The

Power Point slide show this month was not very long because there was not a lot of club activity in January.

In the absence of President Whitethunder McBride, Vice President Mike Meserve opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance. Two visitors from Windham were present and recognized. Dave and Carol Manchester had gone online to find a model railroad club in the area and found ours. Dave explained where he was in the hobby and appreciated being given a tour of the club before the meeting.

A motion was made and accepted to approve the Secretary's report as published in the Signal.

Owen Buck gave the Treasurer's Report and explained that he plans to pay down the mortgage at \$600 a month and hopes to have the mortgage paid within the next year when we will become "debt free." (We need to plan a party for that occasion.)

Larry Cannon noted that the Seacoast Division of the National Model Railroaders Association (NMRA) will meet at the club on Saturday, July 14.

Paul Lodge read the minutes from the Executive Committee Meeting of February 8. Items of interest included the following:

Ed Webb reported that some repairs still need to be made to the snowblower, but it did work to clean the snow after the recent storm.

President McBride said that he has reserved a rental truck to be used to carry the equipment and sales items to the Augusta show.

New T-nuts and adjusting bolts will be added to the legs of the modules for leveling the layout during the show.

It was reported that the furnace has been cleaned as the result of a call from President McBride.

Mike Meserve said that the new security system has not yet been purchased. It will need to be installed in the spring when access to the outside of the building is easier.

At the January club meeting, it was voted to have the Train Fest during the Balloon Festival. It was suggested that Rick James be asked to be the chairman of the Train Fest because of the interest he showed at the club meeting.

For the past few weeks, the Bottles for Basics donations have been taken care of by club member Tom McAvoy, and he has volunteered to continue that responsibility.

Joan Meehan has told President McBride that the youth group is not functioning at this time. Most of the boys who had been in the youth group have now entered high school, and their interests have changed.

There was a discussion about what kind of door should be installed in the hall leading to the lower level. It was decided to check with the fire department personnel when they come for the next inspection to see if there is a preference as to which way the door should swing.

Work is planned to set up a shorter route on the HO layout that small children can use to run trains.

There was a discussion about the use of the facility for the combination Surplus Inventory Sale and the Clinic Day. It was decided to have the Surplus Inventory Sale on the upper level as we have done in the past. The lower level will have on-going clinics throughout the day on various aspects of DCC instruction. The HO layout and workbench area will be used as a location and teaching tool to share information about installing DCC decoders, programming locomotives, creating multiple locomotive lash-ups, and answering questions about DCC. A handout needs to be created for distribution at the Augusta show on February 17 since both events will be open to the public.

President McBride notified the Executive Committee that he is not interested in being a candidate for president for next year. Members thanked him for the good job he has done in some difficult circumstances.

Vice-President Meserve asked for individual reports. Ed Webb reported that a few more books need to be processed. Members were reminded that the Modelers Forum will meet next Thursday (the fourth Thursday of each month). Mike Meserve reported that the shorter Ho layout loop for younger children will be worked on so that it can be used at the next club event. He noted that the modules were ready for the Augusta show and that plans are being made to create new corners with a radius of 90 inches to accommodate larger engines.

On February 24, there will be a special operating session on the HO layout. It will be a tribute to the steam era. Steam engines will be used as the primary power for the operating session. This themed operating session created a lot of interest and members are looking forward to it (some from as far away as Pennsylvania).

Carol Leblanc visited the club to see if our venue would be appropriate for an Easter Party she is planning for the In-Town Athletic Club. After some explanation of the event to those present, a motion was made and accepted to invite the group to have their Easter Party at the club.

Darin Long was scheduled to make a presentation on finding computer website locations useful to model rail-roaders. He was not able to attend the meeting, so his presentation will be added to the schedule at the end of the year.

At the end of the meeting, the 50/50 raffle was drawn and John Erickson won. The Attendance Prize was won by Carol Manchester, our visitor. She chose a railroad-related tile as her gift.

RAILROAD CLUB HO STEAM SESSION

The February 24 Steam Session on the Great Falls Model Railroad Club HO layout successfully used steam power with some early diesel yard power. About 20 members and guests, including

two children, attended the session.

Eric and Darin Long, Roger Plummer and Jamie Robinson brought in steam locomotives and provided steam power to many who did not have their own to run. Thunder McBride, Ed Webb, and Carl Butland also brought in steam. We ran 15 steam locomotives for the session, mostly with one-man crews. There were about as many more steam locomotives available if we had had additional operators.

Jamie Robinson brought two 2-8-4 Berkshires to the session – one C&O and one Virginian. Both are Proto Heritage Steam with hi-bass speakers and TSU-1000 decoders. He ran CPAY (originated Thurston, left from last ses-

sion) to Ayer with the C&O, then returned to Hillcrest with AYHC. Benton Hayes ran the Virginian on a turn from Hillcrest to Mountain Jct. after switching Thurston and the CP interchange with a MEC Mikado belonging to Darin Long.

John Middleton borrowed a B&O articulated from Eric Long to run GTHC. From Hillcrest, he ran HCAY and then deadheaded the locomotive back to Obie yard.

There was a lot of activity and we really needed a dispatcher on duty. Darin Long had a very busy day working the Obie yard. He had at least five trains terminate during the day and he dispatched three.

Eric Long reported that the Hillcrest yard dispatched four trains and had three arrive, plus one dispatched from the nearby Canadian Pacific staging yard. Hillcrest was also switched with diesel power for part of the session with a double-headed EMD model 40 lash up. The model 40 locomotives used to start the day in Hillcrest are designed for small, local switchers for places like industrial plants. Eric had a John Deere and a Baltimore and Ohio model 40

> lashed up the yard.


to switch

Switchers were in short supply. Jamie Robinson finished up switching a track and a half in Hillcrest, using a vintage Atlas S-2 belonging to Eric Long. Guy Lovell worked the IP paper mill with an Alco S1 diesel.

Eric Long noted that overall there was a high operator count and a great session for all. John Middleton summed it up well, "It was a very enjoyable morning's work."
