I used thin steel cable to support the hinged water spout, which can be raised and lowered by hand (or finger). The second was a new kit available through Walthers of a small wood coaling tower. It's a great kit that went together very well. I used the same cable trick on the hinged chute, and it can be raised and lowered too. The third was an old AHM kit that was a bit of a challenge because several large parts were warped, but it came out well and suits my steam era layout.

### **ExTRAINaganza THROUGH THE YEARS**

Because of COVID-19 precautions, the annual Great Falls Model Railroad Club November ExTRAINaganza was not held this year. Instead of the usual follow-up article in December, therefore, we decided to look back at the ExTRAINaganza through the years.

When the Great Falls Model Railroad Club purchased the building at 144 Mill Street in Auburn in 2007, members looked forward to sharing the hobby with the community. Soon after renovations were completed enough to receive an Occupancy Permit, we held our first open house for the dedication of the building on September 19, 2009. Two months later GFMRRC held the first ExTRAINaganza on the last two weekends of November. With very few changes, the ExTRAINaganza followed the same format and activities every year from 2009 through 2019, with visitors each year able to see the progress on our permanent layouts.

Nearly five hundred adults and three hundred children participated during the five days of the first ExTRAINaganza. As they entered the building, children wrote their names on colored train-shaped cards, which they pinned to the "Train Tree" painted on a large sheet of homasote. By the end of the event, the "Train Tree" was totally covered with a variety of colored trains. Activities in the main room included decorating cookies to eat, creating candy cane ornaments from colored tri-beads and decorating spice ornaments to take home. Parents could sit at the activity tables to help their children and to watch the youngest children playing with age-appropriate trains on the nearby play rug.

Trains of different gauges displayed under three brightly decorated Christmas trees in the main hallway were raffled to help the club pay for on-going building renovations. Final tickets were sold on the club's portable HO raffle layout, which had been used for the D.A.R.E. program and taken to various schools and other locations during the year. Temporary G-gauge and N-scale layouts were located in the rooms where the permanent layouts are today. Temporary layouts downstairs included sections of the club's HO modular layout decorated for the Christmas season. Guests enjoyed watching trains go up and down the helix of the club's permanent HO layout, although the framework had not yet been hidden by any scenery. More than forty club members and their families helped during at least one of the five days of the event.

Over the years each of the permanent HO, G-gauge and N-scale layouts has been further defined and expanded, with careful attention to scenery and other details. Dick Clark's interactive ski slope draws everyone's attention as they enter the building and see the first part of the multi-level G-gauge layout with trains running through the tunnels from the larger G-gauge room. Younger children have been delighted with the permanent layout for Thomas the Tank Engine and his friends in the G-gauge room. A portable Brio layout built at a young child's height is a recent attraction in the main room as is our portable original game "Spin the Locomotive" to win a prize. Guest Engineers have been thrilled to operate trains on the extensive HO layout. The area formerly reserved for the portable raffle layout now has a permanent O-gauge layout with many interesting features.

For several years Jeff and Beth Chaffee brought their beautiful Christmas layout and set it up downstairs in what is now the workroom. In 2015 Joseph Gilbert donated a locomotive and plastic track so that young children could ride on his small train. Santa Claus has occasionally visited on the final day of the ExTRAINaganza. Live music was provided one year by Richard Obie with his keyboard and another year by Tami Paine with her guitar. Some years recorded Christmas music was played in the background. In recent years the music has been replaced by *Train Time* DVD's, created by club members and shown on the TV near the activity play area.

Spikey's Station members helped decorate the Christmas trees in 2019; and, for the first time, young guests were invited to choose Christmas ornaments to hang on an artificial tree after they had pinned their name-trains to the nearby "Train Tree." Carmen Coulombe had created the Spikey logo in 2015, and in 2018 she painted a large picture of Spikey holding a "Welcome to the ExTRAINaganza" sign.

Beginning in 2015, the ExTRAINaganza was held on four days instead of five. Thanks to good publicity from local newspapers and the club's attractive well-placed signs on the days of the show, many people visited the club for the first time and others returned every year. Club members helped to make the ExTRAINaganza a successful tradition.


