SEPTEMBER 9 MEETING MINUTES

BRYN DOYLE — SECRETARY

Prior to the start of the meeting, an NMRA clinic was shown featuring the use of photographs for creating building interiors

Jamie started the meeting at 1:01 pm with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Bryn stated last month's meeting minutes were published in *The Signal*. The minutes were accepted as published.

Margo gave the treasurer's report. We are approximately \$4000 ahead and have already made \$37.50 in our new high-yield savings account. Our electric bill has continued to rise; September's bill is nearly \$500.

Margo also discussed membership. Membership runs from January 1st to December 31st. If you join after September 1st, you are current through the end of the following year. If you do not see your name badge on the hooks near the door, see Margo as you are not current with membership. Margo plans to send renewal reminders after Thanksgiving.

Jamie gave the librarian report for Rick. We have gotten all of the slides back from Josh Stevens. Rick is looking into the costs for proper storage for the slides.

Steve gave the report for the O-gauge layout. The bridge has been replaced by Nate Cheever. Steve noted that the 3-rail is running once again, but the 2-rail is not running quite yet. The portable O-gauge layout will also be ready for the Oxford Fair next week.

Shawn gave the report for the HO-scale layout. Austin is beginning to

rehabilitate the Chase Engine Facility and make it appear more realistic for the era they are working to model. Shawn brought up a request for funds for supplies totaling roughly \$400.

No one was present to give a report for the N-scale layout.

Bob W. gave the report for the Modeler's Forum. He reminded the group about the square footer contest that will be judged during ExTRAINaganza. There was also discussion about moving the Modeler's Forum to after the regular club meeting.

No one was present to give a report for the Modular Committee, but it was noted that they will be at the Oxford Fair next week.

Bryn noted that there are no significant updates in terms of advertising and media.

Nate, the new facilities head, noted that he had cleaned up the asphalt outside and has been maintaining the grounds. Shawn brought up that we should perform preventative maintenance now on the tractor before the snow season begins. [Ed. Note — the tractor was serviced this spring and has not been used since it came back; the snowblower is currently being worked on and should be ready in a week or so.]

Margo spoke about the results for the Balloon Festival. Last year we made approximately \$215, whereas this year we made approximately \$1015 with \$592 made from the door alone. It was noted that advertising and door signs were the most significant ways people had heard about our event.

Jamie spoke about attending the Oxford Fair. We will need help setting up on Tuesday and tearing down on Sunday. Tuesday, we will meet at the club at 8:30 am to begin moving things to the fairgrounds. Otherwise, we will be there from 9 am to 9 pm each day with the exception of Wednesday, where we should have people there by 8 am.

Jamie noted that we will be having another surplus assets sale on September 30th from 10 am to 2 pm. We will need help setting up at the club on the Friday before.

Please, continue to think about a budget for each layout. We will set those budgets going into 2024.

We still have the ability to purchase club shirts. If you would like one, see Jamie or Margo.

The layout we potentially were taking from Thomaston fell through because the owners found a buyer.

We have received a request for a presentation at the Abbott Memorial Library in Dexter. This will be planned for the Spring of 2024 and we will have more details as the time approaches.

Joe Landry has extended an invitation for club members to visit his home and view his layout on October 28th from 1 pm to 5 pm. You can get a preview of his previous layout here: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=h2GqLDKdlQk. Since that video, he has updated all of the structures and scenery. If you plan to come, drive down the driveway and park on the land beyond there near the door to the walkout basement.

John McMullen won the door prize.

Steve Doughty won the 50/50 drawing for \$31 and donated it back to the club making the total pot \$62.

The meeting adjourned at 1:51 pm.


DONATIONS



MODELER'S FORUM August 24 by Bob Wright


















Dick Holman – Provided much good advice to all at the forum, as did all the participants.
