OCTOBER 14 MEETING MINUTES

BRYN DOYLE — SECRETARY

Eric Long started the meeting at 1324 with the pledge of allegiance.

Last month's meeting minutes were published in *The Signal* and were accepted as written.

Margo gave the Membership and Treasurer's report. We had a total income of \$1707.25 and total expenses were \$2533.43. We were \$826.18 in the red for the month due to tax payments. She also brought up that all of the name badges have been removed for inactive members from the entryway. If you do not see your badge, talk to Margo to become an active member again. If you have ordered a shirt, see Margo as well to pay and/or receive it.

Rick gave a report for the library. He mentioned the computer downstairs is set up to view all of our magazine subscriptions. He also brought up storage for the slides in the library that have been digitized by Josh Stevens; we will have adequate storage for all of the slides that we have

No one from the G-gauge was here to give a report.

Steve Doughty has returned following his surgery and noted the interest he received at the Oxford Fair. They plan to expand their modular layout for next year. Nate noted that he fixed some switches on the O-Scale layout and is thinking of other updates to come.

Bryce and Shawn gave the report for the HO-Scale layout. They noted that the operating session last week went well and that there weren't any major hiccups. Shawn noted that updates by Jamie and Roger have been flowing well and that maintenance has taken place. Otherwise, there are no major updates and everything is business as usual.

Eric noted that there have not been any updates to the N-Scale layout.

OCTOBER 15 MEETING MINUTES (CONTINUED)

Bob Willard spoke about the square-footer contest that will take place at ExTRAINaganza. You can find the rules to the contents on our website. Winners in both categories will receive a prize. Otherwise, Modeler's Forum this month will be at its regular day and time (the 4th Thursday of the month).

Bryn noted that the media is out for ExTRAINaganza. If you have any ideas of where media can be placed, please reach out to Bryn so she can get them out before the event.

Nate noted that we should get the snowblower as soon as possible. Margo noted that she will check in on Monday with the repair shop to ensure we have it on time.

Margo recapped the Oxford Fair. We did well even though the weather was predicted to be rough as Hurricane Lee passed through. We made over \$1200 this year, an increase from all other years attended. The bin o' cars, train whistles, and t-shirts were our biggest sellers. Many of the free VHS tapes were taken and a good amount of the books and DVDs were also sold. The Oxford County Agricultural Society also donated \$400 to the club as a thank you for attending. If you need a table at the fair in our building, please, reach out to Margo to secure your space so she can get a plan in place. We will also need more volunteers to man the building!

Margo recapped that we made \$1272.60 at the surplus assets sale. Eric noted that it was a different from normal time of year to have a sale and we still did very well. People showed interest in returning for the December Surplus Assets sale as well. Eric also mentioned that surplus sales are a fantastic, low-impact way for us to make money without a ton of work. It was also noted that it may be better to have the sale start an hour sooner and end an hour earlier. Ideas like having more flyers distributed were also thrown around to promote these events.

Margo spoke about upcoming events. We were not invited to the Southern Maine Model R.R. Club's event on November 4th. It was noted it has not been financially worthwhile to go to this event compared to what we can make during a surplus assets sale in December. After some debate, we will, however, be attending the Maine 3-RAILERS show on February 17th 2024. We will work to determine what will be going to the show.

With ExTRAINaganza, we will be needing a lot of volunteers. We will be having a potluck for members each of the days. Let Margo know when you plan to be there and what foods, if any, you are planning to bring. We are transitioning to a more winter wonderland theme compared to the Christmas theme that we had in the past to accommodate the wide variety of nationalities we have seen in the past. The event this year will feature a scavenger hunt and the square footer contest.

Embroidered shirts are still available for purchase. Long sleeve polo shirts are \$35.00, short-sleeve polo shirts are \$25, and short sleeve t-shirts are \$15.00. There is a \$2.00 upcharge to add your name to the front of the shirt and a \$5.00 upcharge for sizes 3XL and above.

We have received a large donation from a layout in Topsham. The donation includes a large volume of buildings and locomotives set up for the CVP Airwire System. However, these can easily be converted back to DC or DCC.

Joe Landry will be having his open house on Saturday October 28th from 1300 to 1700.

The December meeting scheduled for December 9th was discussed and was moved to December 16th due to the Surplus Assets Sale. The meeting on the 16th will be our annual Christmas Party potluck.

On October 22nd, we will be going through George's belongings at noon. We would like to get a start at sorting through these items and determining what we are planning to do with them.

The modeler's forum plans to change their meeting schedule. Starting in November, the meeting will be held at 3:00 p.m. following the Saturday member meeting. Future meeting times will be discussed following the December meeting. The November meeting will be held on the 11th at 3:00 p.m.

We were invited to the Franco Center for the Sights and Sounds of Christmas on December 15th and 16th. We are looking to ensure someone can attend this small show. More information is to come about this event.

Nate Cheever won the door prize. Shawn Doyle won the 50/50 drawing for \$20 and donated it back to the club for a total of \$40.

The meeting adjourned at 1444.


Modeler's Forum Sept 28 by Bob Wright

Bob Willard – Presented his Androscoggin and Kennebec electrified coal car (still under construction) that used to run between Bath and Bates College.



Jamie Robinson – Showed off a Proto 48 SW1 Brass Locomotive he received recently. This model is part of a small run commissioned by an interested group of O Scale and Proto:48 modelers. This particular model represents

an early version SW1 with the two-step hood and arched cab windows, as modified by the Boston & Maine Railroad with full-length handrails along the outside of the long hood walkway.





Jamie also showed a Lionel 10E Standard Gauge Electric Train Set in its original box that was donated to the club by a very nice lady who saw our club at the Oxford Fair. This set is probably 80+ years old. Plans for its use in the club are underway.





Dick Holman – Displayed and demonstrated a set of brass Testing Sieves for Soil Samples that he had acquired years ago at a former employer.



John McMullen – Brought in the dirt used in Dick Holman's demonstration.



Carmen Anastase – Attended meeting for inspiration and spoke about Amsterdam, Netherlands train station and accommodations for bicycles made there.



Roger Plummer – Gave the history on the prototype for an HO scratch-built Portland Terminal Caboose he built. This original three prototypes (from PS-1 boxcars) were used as covered shoving platforms/cabooses.
