NOVEMBER 11 MEETING MINUTES

G-gauge is up and running per Jamie.

O-gauge is making progress, Nate and his wife have put in bridges in the back of the layout, planning is on for a Standard Gauge display above the O-gauge layout. Steve and Jamie worked on engine(s) and a caboose with the Great Falls logo.

HO Scale layout has been set up for the Extrainaganza,


THOMASTON DONATION

Bob Willard – Passed around a partially built
Auburn to Turner electric car he is working on
along with the photo and plans he is using as a
guide in its construction. Also had trucks and
motors that he has modified with pickups, etc.







Jamie Robinson – Showed off a O Scale 2 Rail Atlas F9A (DC) that he rehabbed and repainted in Great Falls livery and added an LED headlight. Secondly, he presented a O Gauge 3 Rail Caboose that was also painted in Great Falls colors. Thirdly he had an HO Atlas SD35 Yellow Box Loco that he rebuilt, painted and with sound, LED lights, a Decoder Buddy-21 pin board (from Nicks Trains) as well as many additional details.







Jay Wiley – Presented an older Bachmann Spectrum Shay Loco he had picked up previously and then had to replace many broken parts. Used Northwest Shortline for some and told the steps he had to go through to make the loco run again as a log hauler.



He also brought in a radio-controlled (electric-powered) Curtiss Jenny Airplane kit he built (approximately 1/8th scale) and showed the plans he worked from to construct the kit, He described the 8-cylinder engine parts he added from a 3D printer. He said he had visited Owls Head Museum with his model while the museum was performing a 100-hour check on its real-life version so he could get pictures of the real aircraft from which he modeled his.

John McMullen – Asked whether anyone had thoughts on using leftover 14-2 wire for bus wire. Showed off a prototype of the bus wire configuration he wants to use on his home layout and was asking for advice on it. He is using a Wago 3-hole connector as a terminal block off his bus wire connection.




