DECEMBER 16 MEETING MINUTES BOB WRIGHT — SUBSTITUTE SECRETARY

Jamie Robinson started the meeting at 1355 with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Last month's meeting notes were published in the Signal and approved as written.

Jamie Robinson presented the Treasurer's Report for November. The club gained \$8,702 and paid out \$2,213 for a net gain of \$6,488. The CD added \$40 in in interest in November.

Rick James reported that the Library has new magazines out and is waiting on sleeves for the slides.

Jamie stated that the G Gauge layout ran well during the Extrainaganza.

Nate reported that the O-Gauge layout bridge work is complete.

Roger said the HO Layout is progressing with ongoing projects. Extrainaganza ran well. With the donations coming in Bryce and Sean will be replacing/changing out some items on the layout.

Eric reported that the N Layout ran well during the Extrainaganza.

Bob Willard wants to thank Margo for the etched mugs for the winners of the Square Foot Challenge. 741 votes were cast during the Extrainaganza for the entrees. Bryn Doyle won the Novice Class and Bob Willard won the Master Class.

Ed stated that the next step for the HO Modules is to add Velcro to the corner modules.

Jamie reported that the \$200 budget (not all used) for the Extrainaganza had a great return on \$s. There is a similar budget for the April train show.

Old Business – Mike and Amanda are at the Franco Center getting displays ready.

DECEMBER 16 MEETING MINUTES (CONTINUED)

Extrainaganza – This year \$3,400 was taken in at the door vs. \$2,200 last year, while Surplus Assets sold \$2,800 this year vs. \$2,650 last year.

The Surplus Assets sale on December 9 was extraordinarily successful, netting \$3550 after expenses (credit card processing costs).

Thanks to all volunteers that assisted with ExTRAINaganza, the Thomaston donation and the Surplus Assets sale.

Upcoming Events – Feb 17th 3-Railers at Augusta Armory, our club has 3 tables and a 20' x 24' layout space available, then on April 27th, the Topsham show is confirmed.

Jamie has shirts for those who ordered them.

Proposed shelf to hold Railroad Lanterns is going to be worked on after the holidays.

Travis has booked the club house for Sunday Jan 14th from 11-1 for his daughters Estella's birthday party. Club members are invited.

Saturday Dec 30th there is an HO Layout clinic day from 9-12.

Op 'til you Drop with potluck lunch is on Jan. 1st from 9AM til ?

Jamie reminded all of Membership Renewals due at end of December.

Club shopping bags are down to half a dozen. A motion was made to order 100 more. Membership voted for this to happen. [Note: they have been ordered]

There is a 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ foot x 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ foot layout that was raffled off in 1994 that the owner would like to give back to the club, if anyone is interested in it see Jamie.

There is a proposal from Ellery Goode to revamp the Riverton Area on the HO Layout and change it out to Portland Union Station and assorted other buildings. Approx. \$2,000 will be needed for the project. Membership voted to approve this project.

Water and Power Signups are available for 2024 at \$30/month, several members signed up at the meeting for some of the months, more still available.

Electric Bill Signups are also available at \$150/month, Jamie mentioned that they can be shared.

The Attendance Door Prize was won by Roger Plummer and the 50/50 Raffle was won by Paul Lodge (\$15) who donated his winnings back to the Club for a total of \$30.

The meeting was adjourned at 3:15 PM.

SMALL LAYOUT OPPORTUNITY

The gentleman who won the layout that was raffled by the club in 1994 has offered it back to the club. It was hardly used in all the subsequent years and the trees have broken off in moving it around. MODELER'S FORUM Dec. 16 by Paul Lodge

The December 16, 2023, afternoon meeting of the Great Falls Model Railroad Club Modeler's Forum started immediately after the club's annual Christmas party, which was well attended.

Bob Willard began the meeting by demonstrating how he makes realistic-looking tar paper roofs. He covers the roof with paper tape and then paints the tape with black paint. The paper tape can be bought at any drug store because it is used by people who are allergic to regular tape.



During ExTRAINaganza, four club members had submitted entries for the Foot Square Model Contest. All of these entries were on display during the club party and the Modelers Forum meeting. Dick Holman's contest entry was a water scene with two airplanes on floats in the water. He explained how he had sanded and shaped many individual parts of the models in order to make them look good.



Jamie Robinson displayed several new <u>Menards</u> <u>O Scale vehicles</u> which he had recently purchased. The details on the cars and the finished look were outstanding, and the vehicles are very reasonably priced..


Travis Johnson brought a scale speedometer he plans to use to estimate the scale speed of his locomotives. He has been experimenting with the speeds of his locomotives to see if he can provide some consistency. He displayed a chart showing the speed variation between locomotives during these tests.



Ellery Goode explained that he is experimenting with making concrete castings using Elmer's Glue and Plaster of Paris.

Kent Waterson brought in a structure he is building as part of a large display. In addition, Kent had a double crossover track switch and showed how he uses a servo to make the turnouts work properly.






